Christmas Letter Writing Template Wide Lines




Our topic this half term is...

From Field to Table

Keeping healthy...

As a part of our learning this half term we will improve our understanding of our own heath and ways to become and stay healthy. We will learn about the importance of a healthy balanced diet and exercise.

Our main fiction text will be Jack and the Beanstalk. We will sequence events and retell the story. We will discuss, describe and role-play the characters.



Growing plants...

We will have opportunities to sow and care for different types of plant. We will learn about what they need to grow and keep healthy. During the coming weeks we will observe the natural environment.

We will experience changes, growth and decay in the world around us.

Language and literacy

will be woven through the

topic. For example, the children will read and write instructions on how to plant a seed. We have always had a strong focus on the development of vocabulary and speech. TALK and Philosophy for Children will be introduced to children's communication.




We will continue to have daily phonics lessons using the Read Write Inc program.

ONLINE LEARNING

We will continue to develop our understanding of number, including recognising numerals and matching numerals to quantities. We will build upon skills previously learnt such as adding, counting on, knowing 'one more' than a given number and number bonds. We will expand our mathematical vocabulary, for example by learning what it means to double and half. Learning from the previous term will be revisited, including that of shape and measure.
