Child Friendly On-line Policy E-Safety



This leaflet is to help you keep yourself safe and happy when using different electronic devices, such as i-pads, computers, mobile phones, laptops, smart TV's; advise you about appropriate content and remind you what to do if you wish to report an incident.

What is E-Safety?

E-Safety means electronic safety. It is important because it helps keep you safe so you can explore, enjoy and have fun.



The internet is great because:

- you can learn lots of things
- you can have lots of fun
- you can stay in touch with your friends and family
- it can help with your school work
- you listen to your favourite music
- you can play with your friends



Some online dangers include:

- cyber bullying - sending nasty texts, e-mails, pictures, swearing on games consoles and sites
- sexting – sending or forwarding on inappropriate images of yourself or others
- stranger danger - some people, who you don't know in the real world, want to talk to you or be your friend. These people are strangers. If a stranger is talking to you tell an adult
- bad language - seeing, hearing or using swear words that can cause upset
- content - some things on the internet are not suitable for children
- viruses - some emails and websites have bugs that may harm your computer, phone, tablet etc.

What should I do if people are mean online, worry me or make me feel scared:

- tell an adult you trust straight away
- keep the messages to show the adult you trust and as proof
- try to stay calm
- report anything that worries you
- try to ignore the person
- block and delete the person



What does our school do to respond to E-Safety issues?

- takes on-line safety very seriously
- listens to children involved and offers support
- looks at any available evidence
- makes sure children face up to the consequences of their actions
- contacts parents or carers
- contacts Police if it's very serious

What I should never do:

- keep worries to yourself
- be nasty or unkind back
- get angry or upset
- allow the person to keep being unkind
- delete the messages
- lie about my age



Who can I tell if I am upset or worried?

- Family
- Friends
- Adults in school
- School Council
- Peer Mediators
- PCSO (Police Community Support Officer)



What does the school do to keep me safe?

- the school maintains anti-virus software to keep viruses away from school computers
- the school makes sure that the children stay on safe websites by filtering and blocking any inappropriate websites
- the school keeps access to Laptops secure
- the school keeps our network and Wi-Fi access secure
- the school makes sure all staff have training to help keep children safe on the Internet
- the school keeps searching safe on Google and other search engines



Remember - Stay SMART... ...and follow our school rules:

S

Safe

Keep safe by not giving out personal information like school names, phone numbers, email addresses, home addresses or photos

M

Meet

meeting someone you have only talked to online may be dangerous. Don't do it without your Parent/Carer

A

Accepting

only accept messages and e-mails from people that you know. Messages from others may contain things that harm your computer

R

Reliable

Information on the internet may not be true and people may not be who they say they are

T

Tell

Tell a Parent, Carer, Teacher or trusted adult if someone makes you feel uncomfortable, worried or someone is being nasty online

We ask permission before using the Internet

- only use websites our teachers have advised us to look at
- only e-mail people our teachers have asked us to
- only send e-mails that are polite and friendly.
- never give out our address or telephone numbers
- never arrange to meet anyone we don't know

Who is responsible for E-Safety?

- teachers, parents, carers and you are all responsible for E-safety
- we encourage all children to report anything that is causing them to feel worried, upset or uncomfortable
